Hoverboard Policy

All electronic mobility devices defined as self-balancing, battery-powered boards, also known as hoverboards or electronic skateboards or scooters, used for personal transportation, are prohibited from use, possession, charging, or storage on Missouri S&T campus property and Missouri S&T –owned or –operated facilities.

Exemptions to this policy:

This policy does not apply to any electronic mobility device:

- Used for individuals with disability;
- Used for campus work or research;
- Tested and certified by an accredited third party testing laboratory (such as the Underwriters Laboratory, UL);
- Granted an exemption by the Office of the Vice Chancellor of Finance and Operations.

BASIS: Information and concerns raised by the Consumer Product Safety Commission show that the batteries in electronic mobility devices can be dangerous and prone to creating safety and fire risk.
